





# **WORLD ROSE CONVENTION 2025 in FUKUYAMA**



### **Japan Airports and Routes**

Fukuyama is most conveniently accessed via **Hiroshima Airport**, but if you are traveling within Japan before or after the convention, you can choose between **domestic flights** or the **Shinkansen (bullet train)**.

If traveling from **Tokyo**, you can fly into **Hiroshima Airport** from:

2 Haneda Airport (Tokyo's primary domestic hub)— *Approx. 15 flights per day* From **Hiroshima Airport**, take the **airport limousine bus** directly to Fukuyama.

For travelers arriving at Osaka (Kansai Airport) or Fukuoka (Fukuoka Airport), the Shinkansen is the more convenient option.


Fukuyama Station is directly accessible from:

- ③ Osaka/Kyoto (Shin-Osaka, Kyoto) Approx. 1 hr
- 4 Fukuoka/Kyushu (Hakata) Approx. 1.5 hrs

This time, we are introducing 3 and 4 in the diagram below.



## ③ Kansai to Fukuyama

If you plan to visit **Osaka** or **Kyoto** on your way to Fukuyama, **Kansai Airport** is the most convenient option.


Located in the Kansai region, this airport allows you to reach Fukuyama smoothly by taking a combination of a limited express train and the Shinkansen, with a total travel time of approximately two hours.

If you are considering sightseeing in Osaka, especially visiting Expo 2025, Osaka, Kansai, you may want to get off at Tennoji Station.

#### Kansai Airport Limited Express "HARUKA"

The Kansai Airport Limited Express "Haruka" is a convenient way to reach JR Shin-Osaka Station. Kansai Airport Station is located on the 2nd floor of Terminal 1.

#### The Kansai Airport Limited Express "Haruka"

The Kansai Airport Limited Express "Haruka" is a convenient way to reach JR Shin-Osaka Station.

Kansai Airport consists of four floors, and you will arrive on the first floor. The train ticket gates are located on the second floor. Please purchase your ticket at the JR Ticket Office (Midori no Madoguchi) or the JR Ticket Vending Machine (Midori no Kenbaiki) in front of the ticket gates on the second floor.

The Haruka train is equipped with a dedicated luggage space for large items such as suitcases, which can be used free of charge without a reservation. It takes approximately 50 minutes to reach Shin-Osaka Station, where you will transfer to the Shinkansen.

Generally, advance reservations are not required, and you can purchase your ticket on the day of travel. The ticket vending machines allow you to choose between reserved and non-reserved seats. https://www.jreast.co.jp/multi/nex/tickets/

#### Shinkansen (Bullet Train):

At JR Shin-Osaka Station, you will transfer to the Shinkansen. Several Shinkansen options are available, including the **Nozomi, Sakura, and Kodama**.

Nozomi is the fastest option, reaching Fukuyama in about one hour, but it is often crowded. However, it is rare for it to be completely full.

Note: Although Nozomi trains run about three times per hour, only one per hour stops at Fukuyama.

> Sakura is the next fastest option and is recommended for its more spacious seating. It always stops at Fukuyama and operates 1–2 times per hour. It is usually possible to buy tickets on the same day you travel.

**Note:** Both Nozomi and Sakura tend to have crowded non-reserved seats, so purchasing a reserved seat ticket at the vending machine is recommended.

**Note:** If you are traveling with oversized baggage (total dimensions exceeding 160 cm), you must book a reserved seat with designated luggage space on Nozomi and Sakura Shinkansen. However, sameday reservations may not always be available.

**Note:** Although online reservations are possible up to one month in advance, purchasing a ticket on the day of travel may be more practical, considering potential flight delays.

#### Lastly,

Kodama takes approximately 1 hour and 40 minutes to reach Fukuyama but is usually the least crowded. Since it has many non-reserved seats, you can often find an empty seat next to you, making it a comfortable choice when traveling with luggage.

Note: If you are traveling from Tokyo, Nozomi is the recommended option for reaching Fukuyama efficiently.

## **Routes using Fukuoka Airport**

## 4 Fukuoka to Fukuyama

If you plan to visit Hakata or Kyushu on your way to Fukuyama, Fukuoka Airport is a convenient entry point. From the airport, you will first travel to JR Hakata Station before transferring to the Shinkansen.

#### **Getting to Hakata Station**

There are two main ways to reach JR Hakata Station from Fukuoka Airport:

#### By taxi:

- Recommended if you are carrying large luggage.
- Taxis can be easily boarded from the International Terminal, with a travel time of approximately 15 minutes.
- Estimated fare: 1,500–2,000 yen.

#### By subway:

- The most **convenient option** if you are traveling light.
- The subway station is located at the **Domestic Terminal**. If you arrive at the **International Terminal**, you must first take the **free shuttle bus** to the Domestic Terminal.
- > The shuttle bus runs approximately every 10 minutes, with a travel time of about 10 minutes.

#### Shinkansen (Bullet Train):

At JR Hakata Station, transfer to the **Shinkansen** for your journey to Fukuyama.

Details are as explained on the previous page. The main train options are:

- Nozomi: The fastest option, reaching Fukuyama in about 1 hour 30 minutes. Often crowded, so booking a reserved seat is recommended.
- Sakura: Slightly slower(about 1 hour 40 minutes) but more spacious and comfortable. Always stops at Fukuyama.
- **Kodama:** The slowest option (about 2 hour 10 minutes), but the least crowded. Recommended if you prefer extra space and a quieter ride.

**Important:** If you are traveling with **oversized baggage (total dimensions exceeding 160 cm),** you must book a reserved seat with designated luggage space. However, same-day reservations may not always be available.
