





Dear Rose Friends,

The 20th World Rose Convention is now just two months away!

In February, we held a special event to mark the 100-day countdown. Renowned flower artist Nicolai Bergmann, known for his stunning flower box creations, decorated Fukuyama Station in celebration. We hope you will have the chance to visit and see it for yourself. The entire city of Fukuyama is adorned with decorations welcoming the World Rose Convention, reflecting the excitement and anticipation of its citizens.

The number of participating countries has now grown to 27, with registrations from Australia, Belgium, Canada, Chile, China, Denmark, France, Germany, Iceland, India, Italy, Japan, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Ploland, the Republic of Korea, the Republic of South Africa, Romania, Slovenia, Sweden, Switzerland, the U.K., the U.S.A., and Uruguay.

We have also received many registrations for the Pre- and Post-Tours.

Japan is an outstanding travel destination, and May is an especially pleasant time to visit, with temperatures averaging around 20°C. Even if you are unable to stay for the full week, visiting Fukuyama, reconnecting with rose friends, and exploring Japan will undoubtedly make for a wonderful experience.

In this Convention, even with a One-Day Registration, you can select the tour you wish to join that afternoon. If there is a particular lecture that interests you in the morning, you can register for that day and then choose a tour that aligns with your interest. This flexibility allows you to create your ideal day. Of course, for those who wish to fully immerse themselves in all that Fukuyama has to offer, full registration remains the best option.

Until now, we have been sharing information on Fukuyama and the convention via our mailing list, but moving forward, we will focus on updates specifically for registered participants.

The final registration period will be open from April 1 at 11:00 AM to April 30 at 5:00 PM (JST). Don't miss this last opportunity—be sure to register before the deadline!



 - Complete payment via MyPage.



The Opening Ceremony will also feature the participation of 1,000 local citizens who have kindly assisted in the preparation of the event. (Rest assured, the entire program will be conducted in English.)

E.Full of Peace and Culture, "The city of Water" Hiroshima

The day tour on May 22nd is a group tour. It's designed to help you learn about the "peace" city of Hiroshima and understand the connection between peace and roses.

Leaving Fukuyama, we will visit the "Peace Memorial Park" and the "Peace Memorial Museum," places of solace for the atomic bomb victims and prayers for eternal world peace. A local expert guide will provide explanations about the Peace Park and its surroundings. From the "Orizuru Tower" near the Atomic Bomb Dome, you can enjoy a panoramic view of Hiroshima. Afterward, please take in the scenery of the Seto Inland Sea and the cityscape of Hiroshima while reflecting on peace.

We will also visit the **Hiroshima City Botanical Garden**, located on a hill overlooking the Seto Inland Sea. The spacious 18.3-hectare grounds feature various greenhouses and gardens in every area, with the fragrance of flowers permeating throughout.

The rose garden focuses particularly on the preservation of varieties from an academic perspective. You can admire Japanese native *Rosa sambucina*, many varieties created with peace as a theme, valuable old varieties and old roses tracing the history of variety improvement, all displayed by theme.







What are Community Rose Gardens?

In Fukuyama, numerous Community Rose Gardens are maintained by local groups, including neighborhood associations, senior citizens' clubs, and Parent-Teacher Associations. As a result of post-war community development efforts centered around roses, more than 400 of these gardens are said to exist today.

Since 1969, Fukuyama City has hosted an annual *Community Rose Garden Contest* to promote community development through roses, bringing citizens together to showcase their achievements in rose cultivation.

While touring the destinations of courses **B** and **C**, you will likely spot many community rose gardens from the bus. Take a moment to appreciate how deeply rose cultivation is woven into the fabric of the community.

Lectures

Dates: May 20, 21, 23, 24

We will host 15 lectures at the Fukuyama New Castle Hotel, located near Fukuyama Station. These lectures will provide an opportunity to explore the latest exciting research on roses, with a particular focus on Japanese and Asian roses, presented by leading scholars and experts from around the world.



The theme for the final day, May 24, will be "New Techniques."

1st Period

Dr. Naomi Okubo: The Genealogy of Fragrance and New Scent Components in Roses

She explains the genealogy of rose fragrances based on scent characteristics and the composition of scent components, ranging from wild roses to the old roses and the modern roses. She also introduces research findings on new distinctive scent components that were discovered through previous analyses of fragrance components.



2nd Period

Dr. Koji Kawamura: The Origin of Mutations Introducing Recurrent Flowering and Double Flower Characteristics into Cultivated Roses

He explains the genetic mutations that led to the development of the recurrent-flowering characteristic originated from Chinese roses and double-flower morphology having multiple origins, reports on research using wild roses native to China.



3rd Period


Dr. Pascal Heitzler: Rosa arvensis: a 30-year Old Experience

He discusses the usefulness of the European native Rosa arvensis as a model plant for genetics. He also reports on his achievements for 30 years, including his studies using collected wild mutants, as well as the establishment of the national collection aimed at applications in breeding programmes.





Breeders Panel















Following this lecture, a panel discussion will be held on the theme of "The Roses of Tomorrow," where various experts and breeders will share their insights. The panel will be moderated by Daniel Boulens, Chairman of the WFRS Awards Committee, and President of both the French Rose Society and the French Heritage Rose Association. The panelists will include Tom Carruth, Curator of the Rose Collection at the Huntington Library and Botanical Gardens in California; Doug Grant, WFRS Vice-President for Australasia; Takunori Kimura, a Japanese breeder known for his *Rosa Orientis* series; Ping Lim, Director of Ornamental Plant Research at Altman Plants in the United States; Matthias Meilland, Public Relations Manager at The House of Meilland in France; and Martin Vissers, a prominent Belgian rose breeder. The discussion will explore future trends and advancements in rose breeding, offering a fascinating glimpse into the future of rose cultivation.

FAQ

Information to help participants prepare for the convention will be sent to those who have completed their registration.

Q: How much Japanese yen should I bring to Japan? Will I be able to use my credit card?

A: During the Convention, lunch will be provided, so your main expenses will be for dinner and any personal purchases. In Fukuyama, you can enjoy a satisfying meal at many restaurants for approximately 1,000 to 2,000 JPY per person. Of course, costs may vary depending on how much you indulge in local specialties or choose higher-end dining options. However, bringing around 20,000 JPY (approximately 130 USD or 125 EUR) should be sufficient for general expenses.

Please note that some establishments **do not accept credit cards**, so it is advisable to check before entering. Many small independent shops and street vendors, especially those selling unique local products, accept **cash only**. Additionally, while Japan is known for its abundance of **vending machines**, most of them require **cash payment**.

Therefore, we recommend exchanging a reasonable amount of currency **before arriving in Japan**. ATMs are widely available throughout the city, often located inside **convenience stores and banks**, and they allow withdrawals using both cash and credit cards.

Q: I am coming from a country that requires a visa. Do I need to apply for a short-term business visa, or is a tourist visa sufficient?

A: Visa requirements and procedures vary depending on your country and Japan's regulations. Please check the following website to confirm if you qualify for a visa exemption. Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan

If you require a short-term visa application support, please contact the registration desk after completing your registration and payment. The organizers will determine whether visa support can be provided. Please note that in some cases, support may not be possible.

Q: Do I have to stay at one of the hotels listed on the official accommodation site (https://en.wrc2025fukuyama.jp/registration hotel/)? What should I do if I want to stay at a different hotel or on different dates?

A: You are free to stay at a different hotel or on different dates. However, please make sure to check the designated starting times and locations for each day of the convention and arrive on time for the scheduled programs.

Q: I have registered with a Full-Day Pass, but can I skip part of the convention to explore nearby cities?

A: Of course, you are free to do so. However, please ensure that you do not select a day tour destination for the days you will not be participating in the convention.



Q: I would like to travel around Japan before or after the Convention. Do you have any recommended options?

A: There are various ways to explore Japan depending on your interests and schedule. If you plan to visit multiple cities, the Japan Rail Pass (https://japanrailpass.net/en/) is a convenient option, allowing unlimited travel on most Shinkansen (bullet trains) and JR trains for a set period. For longer distances, especially if you are heading to places like Hokkaido, Okinawa, or areas east or north of Tokyo, domestic flights are a more efficient option.

Access to Fukuyama

Fukuyama is most conveniently accessed via **Hiroshima Airport**, but if you are traveling within Japan before or after the convention, you can choose between **domestic flights** or the **Shinkansen (bullet train)**.

If traveling from Tokyo, you can fly into Hiroshima Airport from:

- Haneda Airport (Tokyo's main domestic airport) Approx. 15 flights per day
- Narita Airport (Tokyo's main international airport) Approx. 3 flights per day


From Hiroshima Airport, take the airport limousine bus directly to Fukuyama.

For travelers arriving at Osaka (Kansai Airport) or Fukuoka (Fukuoka Airport), the Shinkansen is the more convenient option.

Fukuyama Station is directly accessible from:

- Osaka/Kyoto (Shin-Osaka, Kyoto) Approx. 1 hr
- Fukuoka/Kyushu (Hakata) Approx. 1.5 hrs

Please choose the best route based on your itinerary and schedule.
